Montefiore Nyack Hospital (MNH) has been recognized as a High Performer for LGBTQ+

STROKE AWARENESS MONTH

On May 8th, Rockland County Executive Ed Day issued a proclamation declaring May as Stroke Awareness Month in Rockland County. Montefiore Nyack Hospital is designated a Primary Stroke Center by the New York State Department of Health and recipient of the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval.

When it comes to stroke, every second counts! A stroke is a medical emergency that can cause lasting brain damage, long-term disability, or even death. Nearly 2 million brain cells die each minute a stroke remains untreated. Rapid access to medical treatment oftentimes makes the difference between full recovery and permanent disability. The faster a person having a stroke gets to a hospital, the faster intervention is received to

save the brain and the person's quality of life.

The signs and symptoms of stroke include:

BE FAST to Spot a Stroke

B = Sudden loss of balance

E = Sudden loss of vision in one or both eyes

F = Face Drooping

A = Arm Weakness

S = Speech Difficulty

T = Time to call 911

Strokes can happen to anyone at any age. If you or a loved one have any stroke warning signs, dial 911 immediately. The sooner treatment begins, the better the chances of recovery.

CHANGING MENTAL HEALTH STIGMA

May Is Mental Health Awareness Month. Negative attitudes and beliefs toward those who have a mental health condition are common. Many face stigma, which is a negative stereotype. Learning what mental illness is, seeking proper diagnosis and treatment and educating others are necessary steps in eliminating stigma.

Discussing mental health issues goes a long way in reducing stigma and encouraging those struggling to seek help. Suggested conversation starters include:

- 1. Ask how people are doing, don't stay with "Alright" or "Hanging in there." Ask follow-up questions, such as "Are you feeling stressed?" or "It looks like something is troubling you, do you want to talk about it?" Ask questions that require more than one-word answers. Once you start asking specific questions, you might discover the person you're asking isn't "alright," and then you can start a meaningful conversation.
- 2. Share your mental health challenges. Once you open up about your struggles, others will be more willing to share their story. Talking about those challenges normalizes mental health issues and creates a more meaningful dialogue.
- **3.** Words do matter. Many of us use words like "crazy", "nuts", "wacko" etc. without intending to be insensitive. However, such references are insensitive and demeaning, and we should refrain from using them. We can begin to change the conversation by choosing our words carefully.
- **4. Learn the facts and share what you've learned.** Share information from reliable sources to let your loved ones and co-workers know what you've learned about mental health issues.
- 5. Speak openly and often with your children about mental health concerns. Have regular check-ins with them to see how they are doing. Create an environment where mental health concerns are acceptable table conversation, thus they'll sense your questions about their concerns are the norm and not the exception.

Are you wondering if what you are feeling is depression, anxiety or PTSD? Take a free online screening test at mhascreening.org or visit the website to learn about other mental health conditions, i.e., ADHD, grief and substance abuse. Tests are also available in Spanish.
