- 3. **Stay connected:** Engage in meaningful activities that boost your happiness and well-being.
- 4. Follow a healthy diet. Eating well benefits both your body and mind. Include a variety of foods such as fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean meats, fish, and poultry. Limit solid fats, sugar, salt, and processed foods.
- 5. **Get enough sleep.** Recent research shows sleep isn't a time for the body and brain to shut down. Instead, both remain active through various stages, each serving specific functions.
