HOME CARE AND RADIOLOGY SCORE HIGH IN PERFORMANCE AND PATIENT SATISFACTION

Congratulations to Montefiore Nyack Hospital Home Care

for being recognized for the second consecutive year by Strategic Healthcare Programs (SHP) as a "Superior Performer" in achieving an overall patient satisfaction score that ranked in the top 20 percent of all eligible SHP clients for the 2023 calendar year.

The SHPBest™ award program recognizes home health and hospice providers that consistently provide

outstanding performance in patient and caregiver satisfaction. Award recipients were determined by reviewing and ranking the overall satisfaction score for more than 3,200 home health providers and 1,750 hospice providers.

Thus the role of the caregiver is to ensure that patients and families are confident in the care provided so they feel safe, they feel at ease, and they can take that deep breath. Let's all be brave enough to stand in another's shoes today and every day. Thank you to the caregivers acknowledged below. Congratulations to the units and departments they represent and to the caregivers they tirelessly work beside.

- "Roberto Perez, Security Supervisor, helped save my life. In June, I was stung twice by yellow jackets. While applying ice to the wounds, I noticed I was having a strange reaction. I immediately got in my car and drove to the hospital. I was driving around the Emergency Room parking lot. All the spots were taken. I noticed a security guard. I yelled out to him, telling him that I had been stung and was having a hard time breathing. Recognizing my distress, he quickly told me to pull into the police parking spot. Upon trying to get out of my car, I passed out. Robert's quick, timely and frankly heroic response was crucial in the expeditious care I received in the Emergency Room which ultimately saved my life. A special thank you to Roberto and the wonderful doctors and nurses who saved me!"
