NEW COVID POLICY FOR EMPLOYEES

Effective August 1, 2025, if an employee tests positive for COVID-19 and must be absent from work in accordance with the return-to-work guidelines in place at that time, they will be eligible to:

- Use time from their LTIB Long-Term Illness Bank (Non-Union/CWA/Local 30) in accordance with the LTIB policy, or SICK bank (NYSNA/1199), to cover the required period when they will not be allowed to report to work.
- Use PTO (Non-Union/CWA/Local 30/ NYSNA), or VAC (1199), if they do not have an adequate amount in their LTIB/SICK banks.
- Unpaid Time Off, if they do not have the necessary accrued time available.

As return-to-work guidelines remain fluid, the Occupational Health Department will advise you on how long you must remain away from work following a positive test.

VOLUNTEERS

School-year applications are accepted from September 22 through October 31 for volunteer service 2-3 days a week between the hours of 3:30 pm and 6:30 pm. Summer applications are accepted from January 2 through February 27 for a six-week summer program.
