STROKE AWARENESS MONTH

There are two types of strokes. The most common type involves a clot that impedes blood flow to the brain, known as an ischemic stroke. The other type is a hemorrhagic stroke, involving bleeding in the brain.

When it comes to stroke, remember to B.E. F.A.S.T. in getting medical treatment if you have any of the following symptoms:

- B Balance is off
- E Eyes change in vision
- **F** Face drooping
- A Arm no control /numb
- S Speech change in speech and ability to talk clearly
- T Time is brain

Remember these signs and symptoms of a stroke and call 9-1-1 right away if you think you or someone might be having a stroke. Getting fast treatment is important to preventing death and disability.

Montefiore Nyack Hospital is designated a Primary Stroke Center by the New York State Department of Health and a recipient of the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval.

MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

Approximately 1 in 5 adults in the U.S. experiences a mental illness each year. Almost 20% of adults suffer from anxiety and more than 8% from major depression, the two most common mental illnesses. Mental illness can lead to substance use disorders, eating disturbances, and sometimes suicide.

Mental illness affects everyone, regardless of race, ethnicity, culture, gender, or sexual orientation. And like medical illness, it does not just affect the individual with the diagnosis. Family members, friends, and the workplace are also impacted. Feelings of stress, resentment, frustration, anxiety, and depression are common, especially for immediate family members. Often, it is the silence from shame and embarrassment that prevents a person (and family members) from getting the help they need. By focusing awareness on these issues, we can help reduce the stigma and the silence of those suffering from these illnesses.
